Resolved, that the request for establishment of the Capital Project Critical Maintenance—Science Center and Parking Garage," be and hereby is, Approved. The Resolution shall read as follows:

ESTABLISHING A CAPITAL PROJECT – CRITICAL MAINTENANCE – SCIENCE CENTER AND PARKING GARAGE

WHEREAS, Construction of the 100,000 square foot HVCC Science Center was completed in FY2013. After 10 years of use, the building's skylight is in urgent need of repair to address a leak.

This critical maintenance is essential to the integrity of the building and its 25 laboratories and other instructional spaces that benefit approximately 6,000 students each academic year; and

WHEREAS, the HVCC parking structure accommodates 794 parking spaces and is an essential component of the campus infrastructure. After 13 years of functional use, requires critical maintenance and repairs. The fifth and top level is constantly exposed to the elements, and a gap between the wall and deck needs to be sealed to prevent structural damage. If left unaddressed, the water will seep through, exacerbating existing problems and causing new issues; and

WHEREAS, the cost of repairs for the Science Center is \$9,640; and

WHEREAS, the cost of repairs for the Parking Garage is \$95,000; and

WHEREAS, the college seeks to use unspent state appropriated funds to complete this critical maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the local share will be satisfied using chargeback funds; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Hudson Valley Community College Board of Trustees approves establishment of the Capital Project "Critical Maintenance—Science Center and Parking Garage," at a cost of \$104,640; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Rensselaer County Legislature for its similar consideration and approval.

Upon a motion by Mr. Danaher, seconded by Mr. Pratt, the following resolution was adopted unanimously as printed.

Resolved, that the request for the award of contract for repairs to the Parking Garage in the amount of \$95,000 to Schnell Contracting Limited LLC, related to the capital project entitled, "Critical Maintenance—Science Center and Parking Garage," be and hereby is, approved.
