



## Summer 2021 Health and Safety Protocols

Hudson Valley Community College's Kids on Campus program is committed to the health and safety of both campers and staff. HVCC will comply with the guidance issued by the CDC, SUNY and NYSDOH regarding the COVID-19 pandemic. Below are the current protocols in place and will be updated as new guidance is released.

### Health Screening

A daily health screening will be required. All campers will have their temperature checked and parents/guardians will be asked the following questions at drop off: Have you knowingly been in close or proximate contact in the past 10 days with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19? Have you tested positive for COVID-19? Have you experienced any symptoms of COVID-19 in the last 10 days or have a temperature greater than 100.4? Anyone who answers yes to one of these questions will not be allowed to enter the facility.

### Masks and Immunizations

Campers and staff will be required to wear masks indoors, regardless of vaccination status. When a camp is held outside or when campers are eating lunch, masks are not required. Masks will be provided for any camper who does not come to camp with one. Parents/guardians will need to wear a mask when signing in/signing out their child each day. A copy of the camper's immunizations must be sent to the Kids on Campus program unless already on file.

### Physical Distancing

All camp capacities have been reduced to ensure social distancing can be maintained. The amount of separation between campers will vary depending on the camp. Campers will remain in cohorts each day to minimize transmission between groups.

### Cleaning & Disinfection

Shared spaces, such as desks, will be disinfected between users. Facilities will be cleaned nightly. Campers are discouraged from bringing any personal items from home.

### COVID-19 Symptoms

If a camper is sent home because of a positive screen (i.e. onset of COVID-19 symptoms), the camper will not be allowed back to the camp until a negative COVID-19 PCR test has been received or a physician's note has been supplied with an alternative diagnosis.
